Cleveland InfraGard Elects Executive Council

Cleveland, Ohio - The Northern Ohio InfraGard Members Alliance, a Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) program that gains support from the information technology industry and academia for the FBI's investigative efforts in the cyber arena, have elected their Executive Council Members to lead their program efforts for 2010. The Executive Council meets monthly to discuss various issues involving security and plan meetings and events for the InfraGard members and the general public. InfraGard has quarterly chapter meetings that are free and open to the public that involve the members, the Executive Council, and the FBI, where security issues are discussed. InfraGard participates in community events, such as the Information Security Summit and security trade shows to educate people on information security.
